Dear friends,

Welcome to SPJ's 53rd Annual Awards Banquet.

We offer congratulations to everyone who entered the Excellence in Journalism Competition. These contests are the most extensive project that the Western Washington Professional Chapter of SPJ undertakes each year.

Besides honoring the great work of local journalists, the contest makes possible our scholarship program. Each year the Western Washington Chapter awards \$4,000 in scholarships to the next generation of journalists. The contests are sponsored by the Society of Professional Journalists, the largest and most comprehensive journalism organization in the country with more than 13,000 members.

SPJ as a national organization puts on professional development programs, works to protect freedom of information, and funds court battles involving First Amendment rights. SPJ also is a leading proponent of journalism ethics through its Code of Ethics. Each fall, SPJ hosts a national convention that focuses on these issues. In October 2001, the convention will be held in the Seattle area for the first time. At last year's convention, the chapter received an SPJ award for having the best newsletter among large chapters, in part for our web site www.spjwash.org.

This year we started the year with a program rethinking coverage of Washington's ethnic communities, co-sponsored by the Asian American Journalists Association. Most recently, we had a workshop in Tacoma on privacy and the press. Two of our best-attended programs this year were our look at the media's coverage of the World Trade Organization meetings and our discussion of the good and bad of web journalism. Each of these programs drew 80 local journalists and were broadcast on TVW.

On a sad note, this year we lost one of our great local and national SPJ leaders – June Anderson Almquist. The board decided to rename the Distinguished Service to Journalism Award for Almquist because she herself exemplified service to journalism. Almquist had a long career as a reporter, columnist and editor at The Seattle Times, concluding as an assistant managing editor. She also was a trailblazer in SPJ. Almquist was the Western Washington chapter's first woman president and received the Distinguished Service to Journalism Award in 1976. In 1998, she received the society's highest award for meritorious service, the Wells Key.

In addition the board has established a new scholarship in Almquist's memory – the June Anderson Almquist Memorial Scholarship Fund. The annual scholarship not to exceed \$1,000 will be awarded beginning in 2001 to a female undergraduate student in editorial journalism at the University of Washington. Almquist was a graduate of the UW, and served as one of the first female editors of its student daily newspaper. June Anderson Almquist Award For Distinguished Service to Journalism

In the late 1960s, the chapter defined two awards: "Courage in Journalism," an award presented at the discretion of the chapter to a news organization rather than an individual, and "Service to Journalism," an award given to an individual for a special contribution toward the betterment of journalism within Washington state. They were combined into one under the moniker of the "Distinguished Service to Journalism Award." The award was renamed in 2000 to the "June Anderson Almquist Award For Distinguished Service to Journalism." Almquist, who had a long career as a reporter, columnist and editor at The Seattle Times, was a leader in SPJ in the Western Washington Pro Chapter and nationally.
